



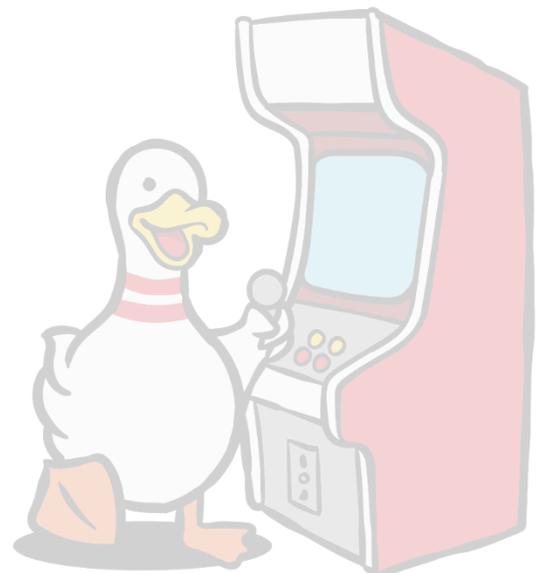
Game On! Track Out Camp

Everything You Should Know....

General Communications -

We will keep you updated on our daily progress and activities through Group Me App. We highly encourage each parent download the app. This is where we post pictures and videos daily to an album. Our group is hidden so the only people that will have access to it are the people attending track out camp.

If you have a question throughout the day, you can also use the Group Me app to either post the question (everyone will see it) or DM or text us directly.

Should we need to contact you, we will use the phone number provided to us on the digital registration form.

If you have serious concerns, please contact us directly – call or text Adam at 919 901 7289.

Parent Communication Policy -

We will contact you for:

- Allergic reactions or use of an EpiPen
- Fever, vomiting, or other signs of illness
- Injuries that require medical attention
- Any situation that puts your child's safety at risk

We will NOT contact you for:

- Behavioral issues or minor corrections
- Your child feeling upset, tired, or not wanting to participate
- Typical social or emotional ups and downs during activities
- Although we will not call you about this, we will let you know about this upon pickup.

Our goal is to handle day-to-day camp experiences in a supportive way without unnecessary calls, while keeping you promptly informed of anything serious, urgent, or health related.

PARENT VISITS

All visitors must check in with our staff upon arrival to gain access to our building. To schedule a visit, please coordinate with us directly. If you have concerns or questions about your child's participation, please let us know.

WRITTEN NOTES

Parents should write a note or send an email in instances of: • Early pickup • Pickup by someone other than those designated as emergency contacts with pickup authorization on your child's account • Medication needs (Please review the "Health & Safety" section.) • Modified activities, extra help, or additional support for your child. We will verify notes to ensure we have all information correctly. The written note can also be an email from the parent or guardian.

CUSTODY

Please alert the Tap It program office of child custody arrangements. It is imperative that official, current court documents are maintained in your child's file if custody or visitation is a concern. Without court orders, we cannot withhold a child from his/her parent. Based on the information that you share with your director, he/she will tell you if additional documentation is required. If additional information is required, you may send it to trackout@tapitsocialhouse.com

The parents(s) who register the child for the program are responsible for payments. We cannot subdivide fees.

If parents are separated or divorced into joint custody, both parents must provide written consent for all names on the Emergency Contacts & Authorized Pick-ups list.

WHAT TO WEAR

Sneakers or closed-toe shoes are recommended since we will be bowling and doing a lot of fun activities both indoors and outdoors. Crocs are fine. All belongings should be clearly marked with the child's name. Kids can have an alternative pair of shoes if that more comfortable for them. Please make sure your child is dressing comfortably and in layers since we spend time outside daily.

WHAT TO BRING

Water bottle (we do have water on site if your child forgets) A bagged lunch or lunch box (we do have a fridge and microwave for their lunch) and a morning and afternoon snack.

PHOTOS / VIDEOS

We will take photos and short video clips of the kids engaging in the activities and play. We will use these to send to you as updates. From time to time, we will use content created to help market the program on social media. Because we are a newer program marketing is key to our growth, we appreciate you allowing us to do this. We will never use children's names in any post picture or video or distribute or share any of the pictures or videos we take. If you do not want us to take photos or videos that is completely ok just let us know. This question is also asked on the digital registration form.

MEDICINE PROCEDURES

Please do not pack medication with your child's belongings. Parents (not the child) must bring necessary medications to the program office. Medications must be in their original containers with written instructions for dispensing. A Medication Distribution Form must be provided for staff to dispense all over-the-counter medications, including topical ointments, lotions, sprays, creams, and powders.

For any children with allergies, we will require you to fill out an Allergy Form for us to have on file.

Generally, children are prohibited from having medication with them unless the medication is dispensed on their person (such as an insulin pump) or a doctor has specifically indicated in writing that the child may self-administer, and safety precautions are met for the safe handling of the medication. If a doctor has given this written permission, a copy must be provided to Tap It. A parent or guardian must give the medication to the program staff.

For safety reasons, all medications are stored and locked in the program office.

WHEN TO STAY HOME

Please do not send your child to Tap It programs with any of the following symptoms: Sore throat • Excessive coughing • Diarrhea or vomiting • Fever • Head lice • Undiagnosed rash, sore, or other skin condition • Any other contagious disease or symptom

A child must be diarrhea-, vomiting-, and fever-free for a full 24 hours before returning to the program. A physician's note may be required before re-admitting a child to the program.

DROP OFF & PICKUP

We keep the doors locked for safety and controlled access between 8am-4pm. We will always keep an eye out for you during pickup and drop off times. If you are at the door and don't see us, please call us at 988 – 224 – 1999.

The earliest you can drop your camper off is 8am. Please do not arrive earlier than this time as we are using this time to set up and prepare for the day.

You can bring them to the front door at Tap It where we will check them in. All doors will remain locked during the day to control access.

For pickup, please park and come to the front door. You can call us directly on 984 224 1999 to let us know you have arrived. There is free ample parking all around our building located at 42 N Main St. Please ensure you pick up your child no later than 4pm as we open to the public at 4pm.

PICKUP PROCEDURES

At pickup time, children will only be released to parents, legal guardians, and those designated as emergency contacts with pickup authorization on your child's account. We will ask for ID at pickup until we get to know you.

If you plan to have anyone else pick up your child, you must notify us in writing. We may call to verify as we want the safety of your child to always remain our top priority.

Students must be picked up by 4pm. If you are running late, please call the main office 984 224 1999 to let us know. Late pickups may be assessed a \$5 charge per every 10 minutes you are late. Please keep in mind that Tap It will open back up to the public at 4pm. We will continue to keep your students grouped together and accounted for until pickup.

If you are going to pick up your child before 3pm please let us know prior. We do a mixture of activities, both indoors and outdoors, and want to make sure your camper is ready to go if we are expecting you.



Frequently Asked Questions

Question: What does the typical day look like at Game on Track Out Camp?

Answer: Great question. Daily we will have a set schedule that includes multiple activities. To keep the kids engaged we will never go longer than 30 minutes on a given activity, or game at a time. The only exception is when we go to the park. Even though we run off a guided schedule we do different activities daily with the hope to keep Camp fresh and fun. So, Monday will feel different than Tuesday. Week 1 will feel different from Week 2. We will be dynamic with what we do daily. Every day we will have some set activities that we do daily to include duckpin bowling and arcade free play time.

Question: What safety measures do you have in place?

Answer: While at Tap It, all children will be grouped together and accounted for. All doors will always remain locked, restricting access to anyone. We review safety rules with the children daily to help promote safe choices while at Tap It.

Question: What is the staff to child ratio?

Answer: Our typical ratio is 1:12 campers to ensure safety and accountability. Because we are currently allowing walk-ins, we staff according to how many actual registrations we have in our system.

Question: How do you handle emergencies or injuries?

Answer: We have a clear emergency action plan in place. In case of injury, parents are notified immediately, and we provide any necessary first aid while ensuring your child remains calm and cared for.

Question: What kinds of activities do you offer?

Answer: Daily children will get a chance to duckpin bowl, play team building games, STEM activities, indoor and outdoor games, and stations, art, crafts, scavenger hunts and more.

Question: Is there time for homework, and do staff provide help if need?

Answer: If you would like us to help your camper with any homework let us know and we can help! We know that these long breaks are important for kids to stay sharp on what they've been learning so just let us know how we can help!

Question: Are there outdoor or physical activities with free play?

Answer: Yes. As the weather permits, we will go outside and play. We have a small turf area where we will set up various games for the kids to play. From time to time, we may also walk to play in the field by Wendell Town Square or to the Community Park. We typically have free play from 8am – 9am and then again at 315pm – 4pm. We try to get outside twice day weather permitting.

Question: Do you offer enrichment like art, music or Stem activities?

Answer: Yes. We will have various stations that have Stem activities. We will also have art stations and prompts as well. Daily we will make a craft and many of our games are STEM based.

Question: What are the qualifications and experience of the staff?

Answer: The director, Adam, is a previous Elementary Educator with his master's in education. He creates, directs and leads the program. We do have support staff, who are staff members at Tap It, that are passionate about children in this environment.

Question: How does your staff manage behavior and discipline?

Answer: We will work with each individual child to determine why the behavior is happening. We use positive reinforcement and restorative practices to help guide behavior. We have a focus on respect, empathy and communication.

We will notify parents of misbehavior. We may separate students or remove them from a fun activity if their behavior is violent or disruptive. Continued behavioral issues may lead to removal any of our programs.

Question: Do you provide updates and reports on activities throughout the day?

Answer: Yes, we post pictures and videos on the Group Me app.

Question: What is the cost? Do you offer any financial aid or discounts?

Answer: For a single day program, it is \$60 / day. For a week it is \$250. We do not offer any discounts.

Question: Can my child bring extra money to load on an arcade card?

Answer: Yes, but don't feel pressure. We will play a set number of games or for a set amount of time daily. Because the games are set on free play, the campers will not win tickets. If you would like your child to be able to play more, you can send money that we can load onto an arcade card where they can win tickets and trade those in for prizes.

What kind of content (TV) do you allow?

Answer: During snack times and lunch, we will put on the TV for background engagement. We control what is on the TVs and will play cartoons that are on major networks and are appropriate. Common cartoons include Scooby Doo, Tom and Jerry and Magic School Bus. We do not play YouTube Influencer Channels or Videos. When we have a movie day periodically. We will let the kids vote between two PG appropriate movies.

Question: Can my child attend even if they aren't at school that tracks out?

Answer: Yes, if you sign them up and they are K-5 they can attend.
